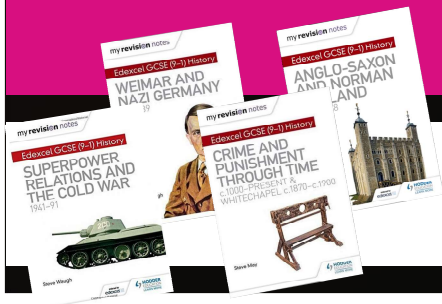

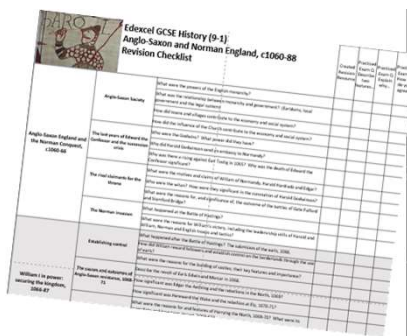

1918	Emperor Wilhelm abdicates throne.	Diktatorship	'stab in the back' theory.
1918	Armistice signed ending First World War.	Constitution	A set of rules for Weimar Germany.
1919	Proportional representation introduced.	Republic	A country ruled only by a parliament.
1919	Treaty of Versailles signed.	Article 48	Gave German President special powers.
1920	Kapp Putsch.	Proportional representation	Each political party was given a % of seats in parliament equal to the % of the vote. Allowed extreme parties power.
1923	Occupation of the Ruhr and Hyperinflation.	Coalition government	Many parties had to work together in parliament, making them weaker.
1923	Gustav Stresemann appointed Chancellor.	Right-wing	Believed in nationalism and authority.
1923	New currency - The Rentenmark - introduced.	Left-wing	Supported workers rights / communism.
1923	Locarno Pact - Germany accepts borders.	Freikorps	Ex-army soldiers who kept weapons.
1929	Germany joins League of Nations.		
1929	Young Plan - restructures reparations payments.
