Northern Gas Maintenance

From Monday 19th February, a road closure is scheduled for Station Lane in Hedon. This will affect traffic leaving the site south-bound, towards Hedon. It is anticipated this closure will be in place for three weeks, before moving further down the road to Baxtergate until the end of this term. Due to these closures, the buses that travel through Hedon (1S, 2SA, 2SB & 3S) will instead use Staithes Road and the A1033 to access Paull or Thorngumbald (whichever is on the bus route) when departing the academy.
