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Curriculum Information



- One Parents Evening and one Settling-Evening with tutors
- Reporting home twice
- Technology – Food, Textiles and Product Design
- MFL – Spanish, French and German
- All students will be allocated into mixed ability Tutor groups
- Ability setting will be introduced during the Autumn Term in September in some subjects

- Daily spend limit of £3.50 – this can be changed on receipt of a written request



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School Planners & Homework



- All Year 7 students will receive a planner
- All Year 7 students will receive a timetable (recommend timetable copied into planner)
- Use planner to record homework
- Homework – more details in September
- Parents/Carers can use planner for contact with school. It should be signed every week

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Extra Curricular Activities



- There are numerous opportunities for students to get involved in after school activities:

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New Uniform

- Black Holderness Academy Blazer and Tie (Jumper optional)
- White Shirt
- Black tailored trousers (not skintight) or a knee length skirt
- Plain black polishable shoes (no logos)
- Sportswear: blue Holderness Academy polo shirt, blue shorts, blue tracksuit bottoms or leggings, Holderness Academy games sweatshirt (optional) appropriate sports shoes for individual sports e.g. trainers and studded boots for 3G (no metal studs allowed)

- No dyed hair or designs shaved into hair



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Attendance



- The importance of regular prompt attendance to teaching, learning and progress
- Notifying the school of illness/absence
- Where possible making appointments outside of school time
- Schoolcomms – system used by Holderness Academy
- Over one academic year the potential impact of being absent from school will have the following effect:
 - 90% attendance – 13 English lessons, 13 Maths lessons, 13 Science lessons and 48.5 other lessons missed. Students who consistently achieve this attendance, throughout their school life, are potentially the 2 out of 5 students who don't achieve 5 levels of 9-4
