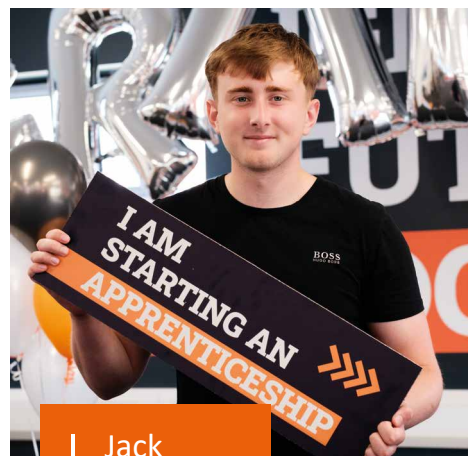

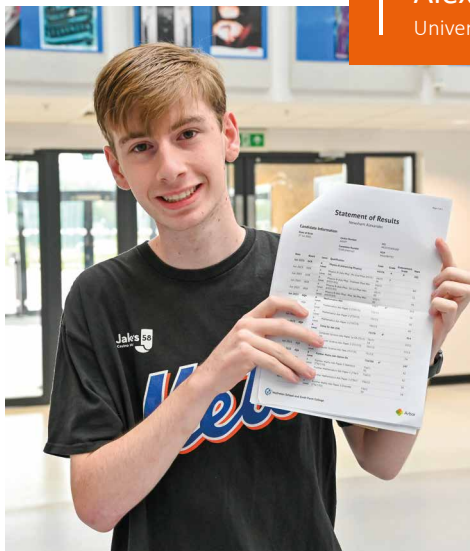

Transport

Transport is available at each of our campuses for sixth form students to use:

- Service C1 and C2 provide transport between Cottingham, Hessle and Wolfreton campuses and additional routes in the local area.
- Cottingham campus service buses run between Dunswell and Little Weighton to campus
- Hessle campus service buses cover Anlaby Road, Boothferry Road, Hessle Road and surrounding areas

- Holderness campus service buses run across the catchment area and through Hull

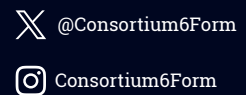
